

**CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BROWNSTOWN  
BEAUTIFICATION / HISTORICAL COMMISSION  
MAY 22, 2012**

The regular meeting of the Charter Township of Brownstown Beautification / Historical Commission was held at the Brownstown Township Hall, 21313 Telegraph Road, on Tuesday, May 22, 2012. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Pfau at 7:00 p.m.

**PRESENT:** Pfau, Boritzki, Golovich, Sheldon, Szymanski, Walters, and Whitecotton. Also in attendance was Recreation Director Maxe

**ABSENT AND EXCUSED:** None

**MINUTE APPROVAL:** Motion of Whitecotton, supported by Szymanski, to approve the Beautification / Historical Commission minutes of April 17, 2012, as submitted. All present voting aye.

**AGENDA APPROVAL:** Motion of Sheldon, supported by Walters, to approve the Beautification / Historical Commission agenda of May 22, 2012, as submitted. All present voting aye.

**HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT:** Maxe reported that the Courdory Road Historical Marker dedication is scheduled for August 5, 2012 at noon. This will coincide with other activities that are planned beginning at 2:00 p.m. to commemorate the War of 1812. The Historical Society Garage Sale went almost as well as last year.

**GARDEN PROJECT:** The water tap should be completed tomorrow and the shed should be installed by the end of the week. Whitecotton reported that many of the gardeners have started planting. There are some drainage issues that are currently being addressed. There are still several plots available.

**CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT PLANS:** Maxe is working out the final details needed before Phase II North bid is ready to send out. The earth work is near completion for Phase II East. The foundation for the Event Barn is being prepared and a December completion is still expected. The Dog Park is being used on a daily basis and the Dedication was well attended.

**2012 PROJECTS:** The Farmers Market is scheduled to begin on June 12, 2012 at noon. Sheldon stated that the budget would not cover many of the activities that she had been working on and expressed her disappointment that the budget information was not given to her before she started making phone calls.

**OTHER BUSINESS:** The Spring Clean Up weeks have ended. A large amount of tires collected here at the Township. It seems that the volume of clean up is now spread between the spring and fall. The maintenance on the township identification signs will begin soon.
