

**CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BROWNSTOWN  
PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION  
AUGUST 2, 2012**

The regular meeting of the Charter Township of Brownstown Parks and Recreation Commission was held at the Brownstown Community Center, 21311 Telegraph Road, on Thursday, August 2, 2012 following the 2012 T-Ball/Softball Awards. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bryan at 7:10 p.m.

**MINUTE APPROVAL:** Motion of St. Louis, supported by Barbee, to approve the Parks and Recreation Commission minutes of June 7, 2012 as submitted. All voting aye.

**TOWNSHIP FEEDBACK:** None.

**COMMUNITY CENTER UPDATE:** Maxe is requesting the DDA to budget funds for the replacement of the Community Center folding partitions and tables. The tables will be a brown paisley pattern to hide the stains and the folding partitions will use the existing track to reduce costs.

**PARK DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS:**

**TOWNSHIP CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT:** Upon final DDA approval, Phase II of the Township Campus Development is expected to start on September 4<sup>th</sup>. Because the weather has been so dry, the ground is now hard enough to begin the drain relocation with the next few weeks. The project has been moving along and looks good.

**GIBRALTAR SCHOOL BUILDING USE:** The Gibraltar School Board at their last meeting made a motion to refer our request for reduction of their building use fees to their Building and Grounds Committee for review and to return with a recommendation. That Committee will meet on August 8, 2012 at 7:30 p.m. and all members were asked to attend. Maxe will e-mail all his information for everyone to bring to the meeting.

**2012 SUMMER PROGRAMS:** The 2012 Summer Program registration numbers were reviewed. Only one complaint was received that the Hunter School baseball field was too dusty and unhealthy for the kids to play on. Hot temperatures and "lightning-outs" cancelled only a couple games the whole season.

**OTHER BUSINESS:** There were a total of 1672 Rodgers Chevrolet raffle tickets sold. The car dealership added an extra \$225 because enough tickets were sold. A player's parent was the winner of the large-screen TV prize. Everyone involved has expressed their desire to do the event again. Maxe suggested that next year we could do what Little League does and charge the \$9 for the tickets up front to each player.
